Trauma-Informed Approaches to Services (One-day)

Achieving or extending Trauma-Informed Care

This training is for service delivery sites. It is intended for a wide range of audiences, i.e., direct service providers, their partner agencies, supervisors, administrators, advocates, services recipients and community members; also, staff including different agencies, roles or service systems work well together in this training, and sessions with family members along with staff can be especially effective. Join us to learn how to apply the six key principles of a trauma-informed approach and develop trauma-informed organizations and deploy trauma-informed practices. This NCTIC training meets the specific service needs of Minority AIDS Initiative (MAI) grantees and other organizations which provide services such as HIV and hepatitis screening, testing, linkages to care, vaccination services, advanced prevention, i.e., syringe services programs, HIV primary care and/or behavioral health services for populations at high risk, or living with HIV (PLWH), hepatitis and/or behavioral health conditions. **(Please note: The train-the-trainer option is available, which equips trainees to deliver training to their in-house staff.)**

Trauma-Informed Peer Support (T.I.P.S.) Training (One-day)

Improving or adding Peer Services

This training is for peers and peer leaders. It is ideal for those who work as peer specialists, health navigators, recovery coaches, health ministers and/or similar roles. This training can also be valuable to administrators, clinicians, supervisors and others interested in incorporating trauma-informed peer practices into their programs. Trainers will define and discuss the biopsychosocial impact of trauma and its effect communities; the prevalence and impact of trauma history for people using program services; share resilience science; and address how the experience of trauma and healing is affected by culture. The NCTIC T.I.P.S. training covers the application of trauma-informed practices in the context of peer support services for people at risk for HIV, and PLWH, through the development of mutual, reciprocal relationships. Join us for this highly interactive, unique training that combines peer support values and trauma-informed approaches to supporting people in behavioral health treatment, prevention and/or medical care serving communities highly impacted by HIV, including racial and ethnic minorities, and groups at risk for HIV or PLWH (and/or hepatitis). **(Please note: The train-the-trainer option is available, which equips trainees to deliver training to their in-house staff.)**
